On the same Day was Elinor the Wife of the said Benjamin Wayger by  
us examined out of her Husbonds Hearing who acknowledged all her  
Right of Dower to the said bargained Parcel of Land to be the Right and  
Title of the said Harman Gratchouse his Heirs and Assigns and  
declared she made such Acknowledgment of her own free and voluntary  
Will without being induced so to do by Threats or ill Usage of or from  
her said Husband or through Fear of his Displeasure as Witnesses our  
Hands
